TRAINING

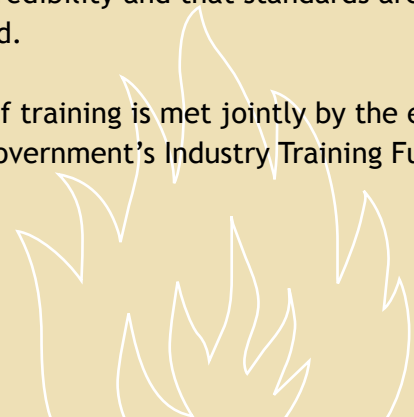
FRSITO qualifications align with the training that occurs within a fire and rescue environment, giving you formal recognition of your skills, knowledge and experience.
